As a lead national trainer for VoteRunLead, she has traveled the country training women of color on the mechanics of running for public office. Her work reflects a relentless commitment to creating pathways for grassroots power-building among women, BIPoC, and underserved communities.

A nationally recognized thought leader, Ms. Amaru has been widely praised for her impact as a campaign architect and legislative advocate. Her work has earned numerous accolades, including being named a Nonprofit Power Player by PoliticsNY and AM Metro New York, a Top 100 Lobbyist by the National Institute for Lobbying and Ethics, and a Champion of Change by the City University of New York. Notably, she delivered a historic presidential nomination speech for Hillary Clinton at the 2016 Democratic National Convention. In 2022, she was recognized by WomeELLE as Female Thought Leader of the Year and featured among New York's 40 Under 40 Rising Stars in Albany.

Ms. Amaru's interdisciplinary expertise has made her a sought-after speaker, media commentator, and advisor. She contributes to platforms such as the award-winning Brown Girls Guide to Politics podcast and serves on the Democratic National Committee's Young Professionals Leadership Council. Her academic achievements further underscore her commitment to understanding and shaping public policy. She holds a Master of Science in Urban Affairs from Hunter College, a Master of Public Policy in nonprofit management from Georgia State University, and a Master of Public Administration in policy analysis from the University of Texas at San Antonio, in addition to dual bachelor's degrees in political science and criminal justice from UTSA. Currently, she is pursuing a PhD in political

science at The Graduate Center of the City University of New York, focusing on political participation, governing coalitions, and agendasetting.

Before her rise as a leading policy strategist, Ms. Amaru served as an ammunition specialist in the U.S. Army from 2000 to 2004, where her exemplary service during a tour in Iraq earned her the Army Commendation Medal. The discipline, resilience, and commitment instilled during her military service continue to guide her work today.

Looking ahead, Ms. Amaru plans to shape the next generation of civic leaders by teaching classes that explore power dynamics and policy-making processes. "I want to empower students to see themselves as change-makers," she shared, reflecting her lifelong mission to transform communities from within.
